Deep in the Forest by Brinton Turkle

A curious bear explores a cabin in the forest with disastrous results.

Hogwash by Arthur Geisert

Mama Pig uses an enormous and complicated contraption to get her little piglets clean.

Midsummer Knight by Gregory Rogers

A bear is rescued by a fairy in an enchanted wood and agrees to return the favor by leading the battle against a usurper who has imprisoned the king and queen, along with their loyal subjects, in the dungeon of their castle.

Mysteries of Harris Burdick by Chris Van Allsburg

Loosely related drawings are each accompanied by a title and a caption which the reader may use to make up his or her own story.
