
you receive lots of good will, positive energy, and the knowledge and satisfaction of being an active member of the Friends. Are you the person who can give a helping hand?

Now that daffodils are blooming it is difficult to remember the snowy day that heralded our main event featuring author Cheryl Strayed. We thought we might have a very low turnout but were pleasantly stunned that we had 920 folks show up at the Mount Baker Theatre to hear Cheryl. The following day we welcomed 180 people to the Cruise Terminal for an interview with Ms. Strayed, author of Wild: from lost to found on the Pacific Crest Trail. This year we added beautiful quilts to the array of programs, and two tasty Wild-inspired treats: ice cream at Mallard's and fudge at Paper Dreams. This was one of our most successful - and delicious - One Book, One Community programs! We are grateful for the support we receive from our Friends you are one of our major sponsors, which helps us pay for author expenses, publicity, and much more. Seeing the Friends cool logo on everything we produce is a very satisfying feeling!

We are already busy planning programs for next year's Whatcom READS! book and author choice. We are particularly excited about this book which tells the story

about the University of Washington's eight-oar crew made up of boys from logging families, the shipyards and farms here in the west and how they competed with elite eastern USA and British crews to get to the Olympics.
